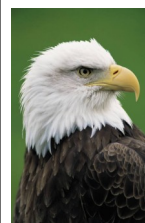
## UNIT RECHARTER WORKSHOP

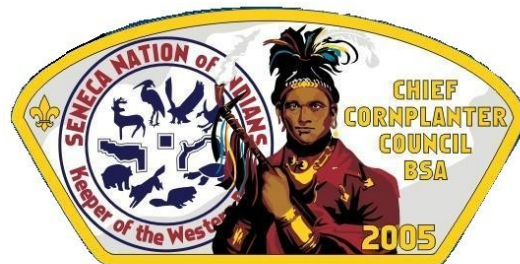

## FAMILY FRIENDS OF SCOUTING

January begins our 2005 Family Friends of Scouting Campaign. There are many new and exciting changes coming with this year's presentations. This year's presentation is updated and is a 5-7 minute Power-Point presentation, and everyone gets their very own Chief Cornplanter Council pen to take home. In 2005, we will continue to offer a special "limited edition" Chief Cornplanter Council shoulder patch; it will be awarded to individuals who make a contribution of \$142 or more. Multiple patches will be awarded in \$142 increments. This figure, \$142, is what it costs the Chief Cornplanter Council to fund one full year of program for a Scout. That \$142 is above and beyond what the yearly United Fund allocation, activity & camp fees, and popcorn sales cover. A major source of income to plug this gap comes from contributions made by the families of Scouts. In 2004, the family campaign raised almost \$10,000 to help support Scouting in Warren County. The goal for 2005 is \$10,500. This may seem like a big jump, but if each unit had a small goal of \$10.00 per Scout, the goal would be raised, based on our current membership. If we want our Scouts to dream big, we have to be there to back them up. If your unit has already scheduled your 2005 presentation, you will be receiving a follow-up call to confirm the details. 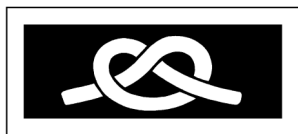

The 2004-2005 Cub Scout Program Helps includes anniversary celebration ideas for each monthly theme. Other resources to help make this event even more special include:

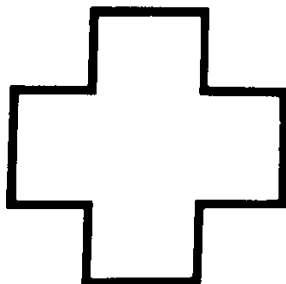

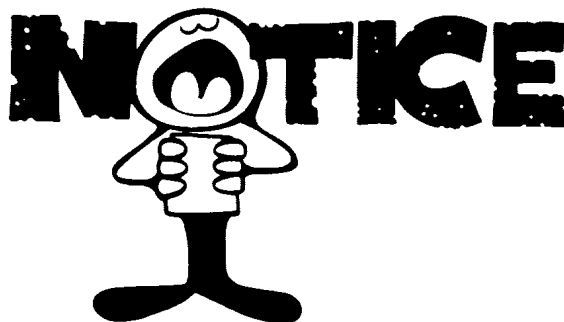
