Siblings and extra adults are welcome at \$25 per person per day (overnights) or \$10 for days only to cover the cost of meals.

Leaders volunteering their time to serve on staff will not be charged a fee for their Cub's attendance. We will accept up to 20 adults to take advantage of this offer on a first come, first served basis. Pack leadership will still be needed.

## NOTES FOR PARENTS....

### HOW TO REGISTER...

Webelos scouts may stay overnight with a parent or with your Pack (with two deep leadership). All other scouts may come to day camp each day as long as your Pack has leadership there. Check with your Pack first to see if they plan to attend as a Pack. All registrations will be made through your Pack.

Turn in the enclosed registration form to your **Cubmaster**. Be sure to sign the form and indicate T-shirt size. If your Pack isn't participating, please submit your registration to the Betts Scout Service Center, 316 Fourth Ave., by May 1st.

### CLOSING PROGRAM & FAMILY PICNIC

On Sunday every family is invited for a day of fun, closing program and family picnic. Come and see what your son has been doing and have some fun. There will be no extra charge for the family picnic unless you are bringing other children or adults who have not previously registered. Their cost will be just \$7. You Must purchase tickets on the first day of camp!

### PARENTS AS LEADERS ...

The Cub Scout Summer Adventure is geared towards participation in various round-robin activities. Parents/guardians or Pack Leaders will be responsible for managing their own Cubs during camp.



### A T-SHIRT FOR CUBS!!!

Every Cub Scout registering by May 1 will receive a special T-Shirt. **BE SURE TO INCLUDE YOUR SON'S SHIRT SIZE ON THE REGISTRATION FORM!** Additional shirts for Scouts or family members may be pre-ordered or purchased, as well.

## FACILITIES

Each family or Pack staying over needs to bring their own tentage. Only family members are permitted to sleep in the tents with their sons. You may bring along cots, air mattresses and other bedding materials.

Latrines are located in each sleeping area.

Hot water shower facilities are located in the main camp. There will be gender-specific times posted for the use of shower facilities.

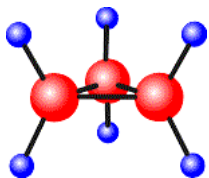
Adults may bring along other camping supplies such as lanterns and dining flies.

**NO cooking stoves are permitted.**

## PHOTOGRAPHY

All families and Cubs may bring a camera or other photographic equipment with them to the Cub Summer Adventure.

The Chief Cornplanter Council, BSA reserves the right to use photographs of campers for the purpose of future promotion and advertisement.



## INSURANCE

Any Scout or Scouter registered with the BSA and attending the Cub Scout Family Adventure will be covered under the Chief Cornplanter Council's Health and Accident Policy. This does not cover medical bills due to sickness or injuries that occurred to your son before he arrived at the event.

## MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS

All Scouts and adults attending must have the new Annual and Medical record Parts A and B filled out for the Day camp participants (to be completed not more than six weeks prior to coming to the adventure by the parents or guardian). Cubs and adults staying overnight must have parts A and B and C filled out by a physician. Forms may be picked up at the Scout office or downloaded from [www.cccbsa.com](http://www.cccbsa.com). Medical screenings will be conducted for everyone during check-in at camp.

## ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Families and Packs are responsible for their Scout's arrival at the Warren County Fairgrounds..

For those staying overnight, you need to be at camp by 8:00 AM on Thursday the 21st of July. Check in at the office and we will assign you a camping site.

For those attending for days only, please arrive the first day between 8:15 and 8:30 AM for registration and check in at the office.

Our day will start each morning at 9:00 with a flag-raising ceremony.

We will conclude each day at 4:00 PM at which time those participating for the day only will return home.

The Cub Summer Adventure will conclude on Sunday afternoon after the family picnic and closing campfire.

All families and Packs must leave the event after Sunday's festivities.

Scouts may not check-out or leave our event at any time with anyone but their parents unless we have written permission given to us before the day they will be picked up. Visitors arriving with verbal permission to take Scouts from camp, will not be permitted to do so. Please do not disappoint the Scout by making such arrangements.

In the event of an emergency, families may leave our event at any time, but must check-out at the office before leaving. Failure to do so will result in those participants not being permitted to return and forfeiting their event fees.

It is our goal to keep everyone as safe as possible during their stay.

The event Director must have verification for the administration of any medication (prescription or over-the-counter) in addition to the directions on the container.

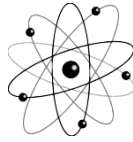

### Financial Aid

If your Cub would like to attend the Cub Scout Summer Adventure but are financially unable to do so, you may request “Financial Aid” from the Council. It is the policy of the Chief Cornplanter Council that no boy will be kept from a Scouting activity based on financial need. Packs utilizing the Scout Budget plan and individual boy accounts, should have enough money to fund a boy for any event if that boy participated in a Pack fundraiser, but sometimes this isn't always the case. If your son has a financial need, you may request a Financial Aid form from the Betts Scout Service Center.

### TRADING POST

A Trading Post will be open during scheduled periods throughout each day. The Trading Post offers Scouts, Leaders, and visitors a chance to purchase Scouting literature, craft kits, T-shirts, patches, mugs, snacks, drinks, and much more.

### TRANSPORTATION...

Transportation is the responsibility of the parent(s). To make the trip to and from the Warren County Fairgrounds fun too, parents are encouraged to organize car pools. Just remember, for every Scout riding in an automobile, there must be a seatbelt.

Refund Policy - Fees for the Cub Scout Summer Adventure are not refundable, unless written notice is received in the Betts Scout Service Center two (2) weeks prior to the start of the activity. Emergency cancellations (less than two weeks) due to a death in the family, illness, or severe injury, etc. will be handled on a case by case review. No refund requests will be considered after the Cub Scout Summer Adventure has begun. Fees may be transferred to another Scout (camper) within the same unit. No refunds will be made for early check out or non-participation. A 25% administrative fee will be deducted from all refund requests.
